How it all started

Aroon Dougan, Fundraising Officer, interviews Jimena Page, Founder Trustee



In the early 1970s Jimena was born in San Francisco to Argentinean parents but spent her formative years between California and Buenos Aires. When she was 11, after having seen children of her own age begging on the streets, she decided that one day she would do something to help children like this.

As a teenager Jimena carried out community development work in Ecuador with *Amigos de Las Americas*. She then travelled extensively around South America and worked voluntarily in several orphanages. Her travels concluded when she visited Lencois in Bahia. It was here, with other dedicated young women, that she founded a soup kitchen for impoverished children. They called it: *Graos de Luz* (Seeds of Light).

It is at this time that she met Jimmy Page and toured for a year with him, while at the same time promoting *Graos de Luz*. Ten years on the project is still thriving.

In the mid 1990s Jimena and Jimmy settled in England, and the Action for Brazil's Children (ABC) Trust was registered as a UK charity. At first its primary aim was to raise funds for all the work in Lencois, and also to help another charity, the Task Brasil Trust, to manage a refuge for street children in Rio de Janeiro. This included a new shelter called *Casa Jimmy*.

In the early days ABC was run from Jimena's home, along with a board of Trustees who helped with decision making.

In 2000 the organisation was registered in the USA.

Initially a part-time worker was appointed to support Jimena. In late 2002 the organisation's first full time Chief Executive was recruited and then supplemented by two other part-time staff, Office Manager and Fundraising Officer. Jimena is still strongly involved, providing regular leadership.

She is Chairperson to the ABC Board and was a Task Brazil Trustee until recently.

Jimena lives in West Sussex, England with her family.

Prime Project Partners



Task Brasil Rio de Janeiro

Task Brasil Trust's mission is to provide street children and adolescents with access to a supportive and loving home environment, ensuring that their basic needs are met and that they are given the necessary tools to go on to lead rich and fulfilling lives and to operate outreach programs for children still living on the streets.

ABC has worked very closely with Task Brasil for many years. They currently have projects across the Rio de Janeiro state including shelters Casa Jimmy and the soon to be constructed Casa Charlotte for abandoned children and teenager mothers, linked to a day centre (and soon to be night shelter) Casa Roger Turner.

Task Brasil have greatly extended their work and established a rehabilitation project for street children, often with drug dependency problems. This is based at Forest House, Epsom College Farm – some 90kms from Rio itself. This new project has gone from strength to strength.

ABC provides substantial financial support to underpin core salary costs at both Casa Jimmy and Forest House this year £60,000. The charities work very closely together on other fundraising ventures in the UK, like the 2005 Christmas party whereby an additional £15,000 was raised for Task Brasil's work.

Task Brasil have a UK office based in London with a small staff and volunteer team.

Viva á Vida Bahia

At the beginning of 2005 Viva á Vida set up a therapeutic community project for male street and low income adolescents (aged 14 – 16) addicted to crack and other drugs in Salvador. It is the only project of its kind in the city. Up until 2005 young people had to go to adult centres which do not cater for needs of young people, consequently many had dropped out.

The project liaises with various groups who work with children on the streets to identify suitable candidates. The following services are offered:

- Drug rehabilitation, Counselling & personal support,
- Education & training
- Family programme: aims to provide therapy for up to 100 family members
- After care programme: aims to provide support for up to 40 adolescents & their families by end of 2nd year.

In order to benefit from the rehab programme each adolescent needs to be in residential treatment for a period of 9 to 18 months. An important aspect of the programme is working with families (if the boy has one), through family therapy sessions. This helps the boys reintegrate into the family once treatment has finished. In terms of funding, ABC Trust has provided £10,000 during 2005 for running costs, and there is a high likelihood of further support.

Some of the children were recently asked why they like the project:

“I think people are nice because everybody talks to everyone”

“Because they are human beings like us that make mistakes and are able to correct them”

“If there was a grade 1000 I would give it because everybody wants to see me well”

Abrigo e Berçário Luz de Escol Rio de Janeiro

Two years ago ABC became involved in funding salaries of staff working directly with the children of this refuge/orphanage based in the impoverished neighbourhood of Nova Iguaçu, on the outskirts of Rio de Janeiro. This is the same neighbourhood where 30 people, including three children, were massacred by a 'death squad' in April 2005.

During the first six months of 2005 the project took care of 75 abandoned children, many of which are babies.

Luz de Escol has continued to go from strength to strength and has been able to improve staffing levels after being featured in a successful Project Sponsorship appeal earlier this year. Thanks to the Consortium for Street Children, £6,500 was secured to fund new equipment, bedding, furnishings and building work. The building work is now complete and there will be much more room for all the children that are looked after there. Further monies are earmarked for staff training and an evaluation report.

ABC is delighted that an additional £30,000 has been secured from the King/Cullimore Charitable Trust to fund the refuge's salary costs until 2007.

"My name is Eduardo and I would like to stay in here (the project) as we get to play, study and we receive gifts even when it isn't Christmas. I like everybody who works here".

Luz de Escol provided ABC with some of the children's case histories, and here is one of them:

Fabiana's father died from HIV when she was only 3 and her mother is living with HIV. In order to help her look after Fabio she contacted Luz de Escol. She then vanished for months until the project team found her and persuaded her to get some sort of treatment. They then worked alongside the local government to reintegrate her with her children.

Patronato (ISMEP) Recife, Pernambuco

ABC began supporting this project in 2003 and a huge amount has since been achieved.

Patronato helps 320 extremely poor children, as well as families, living in the favela of Bode. It also works with mothers by developing their capacity to improve their incomes and hence children's welfare. As a vital community centre food, education, training, clothing and cultural activities are provided.

An emergency home for urgent cases of displaced and homeless children was purchased this year with funds from ABC. The King/ Cullimore Trust then donated a further £5,000 to purchase a second home. The project was also involved in the Art Exchange project Manual Colourido (see page 11 for more details). ABC has provided £17,700 in funding in 2005.

ABC worked in partnership with the project and Catholic Relief Services based in Recife to submit a major bid to the UK's Big Lottery Fund (for some £76,000) to support their work over the next five years. Unfortunately this was unsuccessful.

Patronato won an ITAU (UNICEF Brasil) regional Award earlier this year.

Casa do Teatro Popular Bahia

On a monthly basis this amazing community arts project is accessed by some 60 very poor children and young people at risk in the deprived neighbourhood of Alto da Terezinha.

Their work is focused on citizenship education using theatre, dance and music as the major medium for communication. Often the children perform in festivals and other cultural happenings. Major project outcomes include the children and young people learning circus skills and developing educational opportunities.

Casa do Teatro Popular is run on a voluntary basis, and there is a dedicated team of volunteers to work alongside the marginalised youth. Project leader, Kuka Matos wrote recently:

"We developed this work for more than 10 years and with your support we will continue to do this work. The support of ABC has been very important for the continuation of helping the children in the community, the enlargement and consolidation of the project and other artists and partner groups."

In 2005 ABC made £4,000 available for equipment and core running costs. This also helped complete their new centre Casa da Cultura in the favela of Bom Jua, Salvador.

Update On Other Project Partners

Abrigo de Mae Preta (Friends of Maria)

Bahia

Under the management of Friends of Maria charity, the accommodation for the children accessing this shelter has vastly improved, including the kitchen and bathroom areas, plus urgent repairs to the roof. ABC assisted with Friend of Maria Trustees' travel costs and prioritised improved education opportunities for some 25 children with local Non-governmental Organisation (NGO) Sociedade Irmãos Solidários by paying for food, teacher salaries and electricity costs. Plans for the future include a Childcare centre in central Salvador with money from the BBC Lifeline Appeal.

Associação de Apoio á Criança

Sao Paulo

ABC has funded the salaries of two educators at this project for street children since late 2003. AA Criança works intensively with street children helping them in any way possible to lessen the pain of living on the street, and looking for alternatives for them beyond street life.

In late 2005 ABC agreed to fund the purchase and insurance costs of a new vehicle to allow the project to transport children to educational activities and on field trips. Total funding for 2005 was just under £20,000.

Their project leader, Everaldo Santos Oliveira, was at the Silverstone Ball speaking alongside Jimena Page.

Avante Lençois

Associação de Apoio á Criança em Risco (ACER)

Sao Paulo

This project is based in the favela of Eldorado (Diadema) working with up to 350 children and youth at risk. ABC has assisted with funding of £5,000 in 2005 for an educator's salary.

Avante Lençois

Bahia

Long-standing project partners Avante Lençois are a community action group working from a community centre. The project provides arts, citizenship and education workshops for 70 children and teenagers at risk. Peer group education is centre stage, and they run a community newspaper, radio station, library and internet café. A further 250 very poor local families benefit. ABC provides core funding towards salaries, in 2005 this was £10,000.

Centro Cultural de Aldeia de Monte

Pernambuco

Having provided previous support to this community based project in Olinda, ABC helped again with a small donation of £2,000 so up to 100 youth at risk could access health care, education, training and cultural activities. Personal support and counselling is also provided by volunteer project managers.



Circo Picolino

Circo Picolino

Bahia

Many teenagers have now succeeded in becoming instructors themselves at the circus project and are now passing on their skills to the younger children. Many hundreds of poor children benefit from circus skills training and educational opportunities. Public and school performances are well attended. The project is very successful and has secured international recognition. ABC is one of many funding partners, providing £12,000 in 2005 with money from the BBC Lifeline Appeal.

Crianças Famintas (Children in Hunger)

Ceara

ABC has been supporting this project for several years which works in the two favelas of 31 de Março and Morro de Vitoria in the state capital of Fortaleza. Their work is centred on providing food to more than 175 children. Recent ABC support has allowed for the introduction of educational work with paid teachers and educators, so that children can access literacy, citizenship and craft skills.

With added support through our Project Sponsorship Appeal in 2005 the project has developed further. They re-built a dilapidated centre, providing for a much improved environment, kitchen and more space thus enabling them to help more children. Total funding in 2005 was £9,500.



Children in Hunger

Estrela da Amanha Pernambuco

ABC has helped this project buy and refurbish a Child Development Centre in the small town of Umbuzeiro. The new centre helps up to 100 impoverished children everyday providing food, medical and dental care, educational activities and clean drinking water. The project is run by volunteers. In 2005 £7,000 was provided from funds raised in the BBC Lifeline appeal towards completing the refurbishment.

Graos de Luz Bahia

This is one of ABC's main projects which works to improve the quality of life and education of more than 200 low-income children and families in Lençóis through workshops, training and building a network of cultural groups. Its outreach work reaches more than 1,000 children in the Chapada Diamantina region. ABC funding amounted to £10,000 in 2005 for project salaries.

Nos do Cinema Rio de Janeiro

The aims of this project are to use audio and visual technology to complement education and also to provide a livelihood for up to 200 children and young people living in Rio's favelas. Young people are encouraged to use their imagination and broaden their horizons in order to make films both documentary and fictional. In 2005 ABC provided funding of £7,000 to help towards their core running costs and a youth exchange programme to the UK (see page 11 for more details).

Projeto Renascer Joao Pessoa, Paraiba

ABC started supporting this project in 2003 which helps more than 250 children. With ABC support of £9,000 this year they have acquired more educational workshop space, paid salaries and installed new computers. Four new dance groups have been set up and the project participated in the art exchange project Manual Colourido (see page 11 for more details). The project aims to diminish suffering caused by poverty and provides psychological, education and nutritional aid as well as art and dance initiatives.

Rainbow Farm Itabirito, Minas Gerais

The Rainbow Farm Trust, based in the UK supports Rainbow Farm, a developing project in Itabirito, whose central vision is to provide a home for abused and abandoned children who cannot return to their families, and to assist in facilitating adoptions. The project currently offers short holidays and retreats to children and carers from local projects.

They recently approached ABC to request funding for a new house which will enable ten children to live on the farm permanently. ABC are supporting them through Silverstone Grand Prix Ball 2006 and hope to provide further support during 2006.



Projeto Renascer

Viva Rio Rio de Janeiro

Viva Rio is a large Brazilian NGO actively involved in a wide range of work to help disadvantaged youth at risk in Rio's poorest drug-infested favelas. One of their projects includes a new centre for sports and education activities called Luta Pela Paz. ABC have helped the organisation fundraise in the UK and passed over almost £7,000 to support education and social action work.

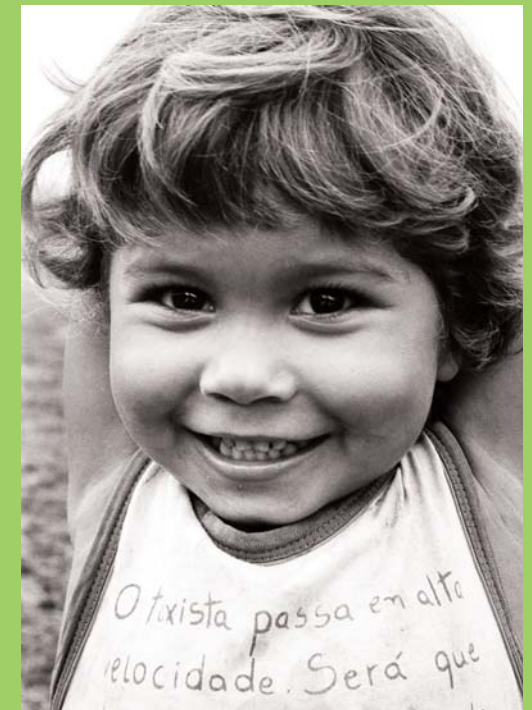

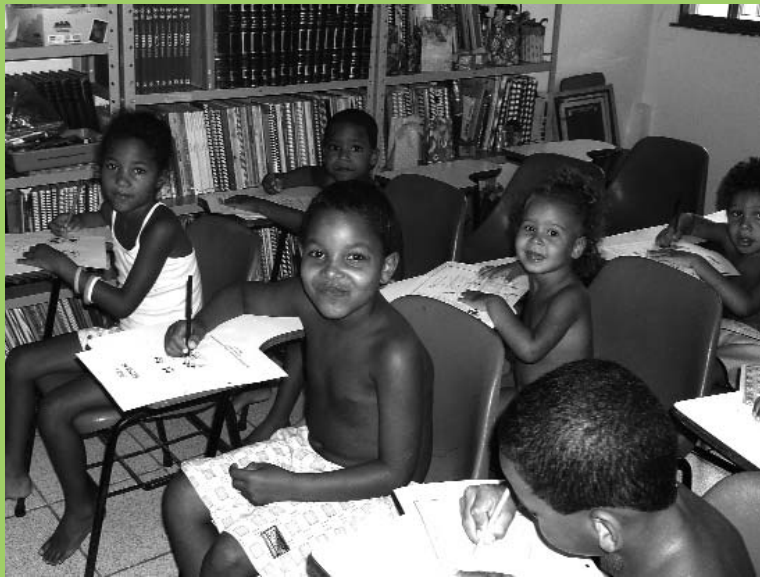

10th Anniversary Achievements

Fundraising Events

2005 was marked by success. To celebrate our 10th Anniversary many fundraising events were held and we were fortunate in receiving substantial grants to support our work in Brazil. Here are just a few of the highlights:

Silverstone Grand Prix Ball



The Grand Prix Ball kicks off the F1 Grand Prix weekend at Silverstone in Buckinghamshire. We were one of two beneficiary charities and sold twenty tables to supporters both old

and new. Held at Stowe School on Friday 8th July the night included a champagne reception, a three course dinner, auction and an exclusive performance by the legendary Lionel Ritchie. Zepfest

Back in May 2005, ABC Trustee Graeme Hutchinson and his stalwart fundraising partner Gary Davies organised a stunning Led Zep convention at Northampton's *Roadmender*. It was a truly spectacular event with mind-blowing performances from Boot Led Zeppelin and Simply Led plus a charity auction featuring signed Led Zeppelin memorabilia. The event raised £9,000.

Riffathon



The second Riffathon (a rock guitar competition) took place at the Hammersmith Palais. Jimmy Page, Brian May and Dan Hawkins were among the judges and three extremely talented winners were chosen

from a gifted group of young performers.

Mini Chill

Another unique event where ABC friends got the chance to chill out on a beautiful estate in the Oxford countryside. There were a host of upcoming bands who played while Indian food was provided alongside a bar full of ABC's own beer. As the sun set people enjoyed DJ's and VJ's while lounging around on hay bales at a proper English affair! As people arose the next morning there were fry-ups all round. The weekend raised over £15,000.

V Festival



V Festival also celebrated its 10th Anniversary this year and we collaborated with them at Hylands Park, Chelmsford. Not only did we have a stall, we also had a Hummer which attracted loads of attention in all its bright yellow glory. Mark Ereira CEO managed to catch up with Oasis backstage and got a Gibson guitar signed. This year's raffle was also drawn at V and some lucky winners are jetting off to Rio de Janeiro courtesy of VARIG Brazilian Airlines. The event raised just over £3,000.

2005 Christmas Party



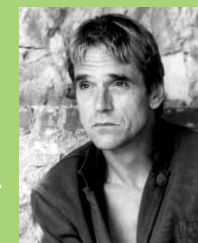

New Partners Embratur Partnership

Sustainable Tourism and Childhood Seminar

In conjunction with the Brazilian Ministry of Tourism, a conference on Sustainable Tourism and Childhood was held in Rio de Janeiro in October. Jimena Page was asked to speak at the conference about the work of ABC, social responsibility and the role our patrons have played within the charity. It was a chance to meet influential people from other charities as well as private organisations.

Project Partners

Streets of Brazil Educational CD-Rom

The headquarters of ABC Trust have now moved to London, where the Board of Trustees and a small staff team determine policy and co-ordinate programme development, plan and approve annual budgets and guide and oversee all fundraising.

ABC seeks to maximise the use of its funds to benefit children and young people including the employment of local Brazilian staff in all program locations removing the cost of any high ex-patriot employees.

Local project partners are all non governmental organisations (NGO's) recognised by Brazil's authorities.

They are selected according to local needs as well as agreed ABC Project Criteria and Application Form. All funded projects are obliged to sign up to the Trust's Child Protection Policy and Partnership agreements.

Accounts are audited on a pro-bono basis annually by accountants **Joan Hudson & Co**, (and are available on request). They kindly organise staff payroll as well. Local accountancy work is provided by Neil Lancaster, **Financial Management Services**.

All the Trust's legal advice is provided on a pro-bono basis by **Lovells**.

Mobile phones for staff use are sponsored by **Virgin Mobile**.

VARIG Brazilian Airlines have donated copious flights for raffles, auctions and for Trustee/Staff visits to Projects in Brazil.

Financial Summary

In 2005/6 (our financial year runs to end of January) our income was **£505,000**, a 28% increase on 2004/5. From this **£230,000** was spent on direct project funding and support costs. £180,000 has been carried forward to 2006/7 (subject to final audit). The number of supported project partners rose to 18 with five new project applications submitted.

Estrela

In order to monitor and evaluate the work of our project partners and the service we provide to them, Estrela, a British and Brazilian NGO, are carrying out a one year study on how the services could improve.

Special Project Work

Nos do Cinema UK Tour, Bringing Young People Together

In late February three actors from ABC supported project Nos do Cinema came to the UK and toured London, Bury St Edmunds and Liverpool.

Nos do Cinema was set up with help from acclaimed film director and ABC patron Fernando Meirelles in order to cast the actors for the award winning film City of God. The group teaches young people from Rio de Janeiro's favelas to produce films and documentaries.

The three actors spent their first week in London visiting various areas of the city in order to acclimatize themselves to such a different culture. A debate session was held at Queen Mary University with over 100 students.

Another discussion event was held at the Guanabara Club. This was attended by Fernando Meirelles and was a great chance for the actors to speak to Brazilian's living in the UK and find out about their experiences over here.

A special screening of City of God took place at the Everyman Cinema. The actors then held a question session where members of the audience got to find out more about the making of the film and the story behind it.

The actors then travelled to Bury St Edmunds where the ABC office is based and held a session with media students from the local area.

During their time in Liverpool, the actors held sessions with students from the University of Liverpool. They found this more enjoyable than their time in London, finding the city and people much more diverse.

This exchange trip was funded by the Trust and proved to be extremely successful, with many links established and future exchanges planned.

Project Manual Colourido

There is so much talent, warmth and energy in Brazil's favelas, yet poverty and lack of opportunities often conspire to let this shine through. All children have vitality and a thirst for learning, gaining new skills and expressing pride in the environments in which they live.

An intrinsic part of the ABC Trust charitable mission is to provide resources and funding so that the impoverished children we support can learn and develop valuable skills.

Projeto Manual Colourido, an exciting art exchange project, began last year when artists Fabiane Perella and Pete Vosper visited two ABC project partners and produced a collaborative art piece with 300 children.

The children took digital cameras which they had never seen, let alone used, so it was a completely new experience for them, and took photos of their surroundings. These photos were then made into a huge digital image.

Each child had a section of the 'big' picture which they painted on canvas. The experience affected each child differently, making many more self-confident, encouraging the children to work together and also teaching them to experiment with paints and styles of painting.

The work was brought back to the UK and shown at Gallery 32, London, throughout December.

This project was a prime example of how much children who have nothing can gain from being allowed to express themselves through having opportunities opened up to them.

Specific fundraising took place to undertake the Manual Colourido Project.
